

Chester “Jerzeebred” R. Brathwaite IV passed away unexpectedly on Wednesday, June 7, 2023 at the age of 43.

Chester was born on December 2, 1979 to Kim Anderson and Chester Radcliffe Brathwaite IV.

Brath attended Pleasantville High School as the class of 1998. He played every sport in the book from basketball, baseball, and football. After high school he went off to join the Army and went on to serve 3 years and 1 month. In the Army he would become a Combat Engineer , finishing as an E4 specialist. Brath started out his MC life with the City 2 City Street Burners. He would then move on to join the King of Clubs MC in 2011, where he would then serve as the Vice president, and would later become recognized as one of the founders. Brath became an honorary member of King Clubs in 2020.
